- *Submit each nomination letter on the agency's letterhead and limit to two standard type pages. Nominations can be mailed or emailed. If emailed, submit in Microsoft Word or Adobe Acrobat format. Include agency information and contact information of both the submitter and nominee.*

Volunteer Award - the Volunteer Coordinator and Agency Supervisor

Coordinator Award - a volunteer and Agency Supervisor

Team Award - the Coordinator and Agency Supervisor

- *Nominations must be received by mail or e-mail by 5 pm September 13, 2019. Late nominations will not be considered.*
